Society of America Handbook For Growers, Exhibitors, and Judges 2022 Edition, and awarded a ribbon as merited. To exhibit, you must be a MAAVS member.

The April 15, 2023, Board meeting was called to order at 5:09pm with 9 members present.

Minh thanked Linda K. and Sandy for the posters and postcards advertising the upcoming MAAVS conversation to hand out at the shows he has been judging. It was brought up that we are not an affiliate of the Gesneriad Society and perhaps we should be, and we would be able to advertise at their show in July to be held in Richmond Virginia. Minh will find out what the cost is to be an affiliate and report back to the board.

Minh discussed getting the ribbons ordered, Linda K. will give him the contact for the company she ordered ribbons from for her club show. Ken recommended we consider changing over to a sticker for best in class and only giving out ribbons for the upper awards. As of right now the club still has a lot of BIC ribbons but we will consider that when we run low on them for future shows.

Sandy discussed the options for the meals for the show. Costs will be increased to as much as \$9.00 per meal as we were charged 2020 prices at the 2022 show, because of locked-in rates

for our show that was postponed. So, it does seem like a large increase, but

we must take that into account. It was decided that we will be offering a buffet for Friday night and a served meal for the Saturday evening banquet meal.

Ken inquired about the fee for judges auditing our judging school. It was agreed that the fee of \$20.00 will be charged to all that are attending the judging school.

AVSA approached Minh about having their Executive Committee attend our show and us hosting them for their meeting. Minh emailed the board and there were no objections, so he accepted the opportunity for MAAVS to host the AVSA Executive Committee during our show in November.

Donna mentioned that Black Oak Violets will no longer be a vendor, and that if anyone had any other vendors, they could recommend she would be happy to reach out to them to try to get another vendor or two at the convention.

It has been decided that a Hospitality Chair needs to be put into place, Laura Spelbring volunteered at our meeting in November, Minh and Jackie will discuss this with her at the Tidewater show. April Van Ness has also volunteered to assist her.

Sandy mentioned that we will need 2 clubs to volunteer for table favors and Linda K. offered to see if she could get her club to volunteer for one of the evenings.

Donna will reach out to Tom Finnigan from the Liberty Bell Gesneriad Society to take photos of the show again this year, he took them last year without us even asking, and then sent us a link to share via Facebook with all the show photos and they were very nice.

Linda S. is still trying to obtain the federal tax exemption letter so we can find out if our club would qualify as tax exempt in Maryland with the hotel. She hopes to have that information soon.

Plans are underway to be able to register for show this year online so there would be no need to mail in a registration form unless you wish to pay by check. Please keep in mind there are processing fees the credit card company charges and those will be passed on to the members that wish to use this convenience. This will be tested and rolled out if everything functions correctly.

We are still in need of someone to volunteer to oversee the Ways and Means, that would involve getting the donations, putting out the sheets for the silent auction, monitoring the section or getting volunteers to sign up for slots to monitor the tables, and at the end of the show contacting the winners and collecting the money for the items. If anyone is interested, please reach out to Sandy Pine or Jackie Leitzel and we will get you the information you need. This has always been a good opportunity for our club to make some money to help with show expenses. It would be a shame to not have this available at our show this year, because of lack of help.

Discussion of the 2024/2025 show was brought up by Minh: Rodney has begun to look at places in York, PA but so far there are not really any options, he will continue to look and keep us posted.

Minh brought up the idea of moving our convention to take place in early March as part of the Philadelphia Flower Show, after some discussion of how this could work a motion was made by Ken and seconded by Linda K. that Minh would reach out to the Flower Show and see if they would be willing to work with us to be a part of their event. More information on this is to come as it becomes available.

The meeting was ended at 6:38pm

AVSA Show Room Opens

Common Sense African Violet Judging Guide for Point Scoring by Kenneth Barbi, Master AVSA Judge



Have you ever wondered how AVSA judges can walk into a show and pick the winners so easily? Well, it takes skill and years of training - - and a good measure of **common sense**! As a Clerk at a judged show, have you ever wondered how a judge can look at a single class with 10 or15 entries in 5 or 10 seconds declaring all the blues and reds; and the Best-in-Class? Again - **common sense**!

Reds stand out like "sore thumbs", and so do "low blues" all based on apparent "ball park" quantitative point losses for different problems. Then it's the "high blues" completing in the judges' minds to pick the Best in Classes. Take a look at this listing from the **May 2022 Handbook for African Violet Grower, Exhibitors, and Judges;** and you should see the big point loss categories such as symmetry or lack of bloom. (As an aid, I have posted a single page PDF **Guide** on our web site called **Common Sense African Violet Judging Guide for Point Scoring** located at <u>https://www.midatlanticafricanvioletsociety.org/Common Sense</u> Judging Techniques.pdf which has AVSA's "Judging the Show Plant" graphic from the November - December 1998 AVM included.) The big point loss categories are what rapidly put your plants in the different color categories.

Plant Size:

- Standard plants must be greater than 8 inches in diameter (if less deduct up to 3 points).
- *Semiminiature plants* must be 8 inches or less in diameter (if greater they are eliminated from consideration). Pot ratio does not apply.
- *Miniature plants* must be 6 inches on less in diameter (if greater they are eliminated from consideration). Pot ratio does not apply.
- *Trailers* (under form) must have 3 crowns with at least 1 crown blooming (if only 2 crowns deduct 11 points; if only 1 crown deduct 22 points).

Standard, Miniature, and Semiminiature Plants

Symmetry:

Deduct up to 3 points for each instance of: Gaps or spaces between the leaves or rows of leaves Breaks in the symmetry of the leaf pattern Uneven distribution of foliage Condition (Cultural Perfection or Grooming):

Spent blossom ¹/₂ point per blossom

Limp, damage, marred, discolored or faded blossoms deduct up to ½ point for each Marred, broken, dead, etc; petiole and peduncle stubs, suckers not completely removed, smaller leaves, dust, soil or traces of spray deduct up to 1 point

Over or under potted, long neck, plant not centered or standard plants less than 8 inches deduct up to 3 points. If miniature and semiminiature plants are more than 6 inches or 8 inches respectively, they are eliminated from consideration).

Suckers if present causes the plant to be eliminated from consideration *Quantity of Bloom:*

Blossom count too low deduct proportional amount of points - - if plant should have 30 blossoms and only has 15, deduct 12 ½ points out of 25.

Size and type of bloom:

Deduct up to 5 points for lack of size according to variety

Deduct ¹/₂ point for each type of blossom not constant or true to variety *Color of bloom:*

Deduct up to 10 points for wrong hue or value

Deduct 1/2 point for each solid color instead of multicolor blossom

Deduct 10 points if blossom color is completely different


Trailers

Form:

Trailers must have 3 crowns (if 2 crowns deduct 11 points; if 1 crown deduct 22 points)

Blossoms not on every crown deduct a reasonable number of points such as: if one crown has no blossoms and the blossom point score is 25 points, take 8 points off. Blossoms not evenly distributed on all 3 main crowns, deduct a reasonable number of points.

This information is as of April 19, 2023 from the May, 2022, AVSA Handbook for Growers, Exhibitors, and Judges

As a Senior Judge she was asked to judge at numerous violet club's shows in the tri-state area that comprises PA, NJ, DE, MD. Joan's enthusiasm for African violets also extended into additional affiliates of AVSA. She has been a member of the Mid-Atlantic African Violet Society (MAAVS) for 23 years and held positions as President, Immediate Past-President, Chairman of Special Committees, Chairman of Standing Committee and Affiliate Director. She loved traveling to all the shows and thoroughly enjoyed the good times.

In 2012 Joan received an Honorary AVSA membership at the 2011 AVSA National Convention in Cherry Hill, NJ and in 2020 Joan received the Hudson Award from AVSA.

Joan was an inspiration to all of us who met her over the years. She will be missed.

MAAVS 2023 Show Design Schedule

"Violets in the Animal Kingdom"

<u>**Plant Arrangements**</u> – Use one or more blooming (unless otherwise mentioned) African violet plants, remove from the pot, in a design with other fresh cut, dried, or treated plant

material. Niches are white. Backboards or draping may be used if attached with pins, but tape in not permitted on the niches. You must include an index card with each exhibit naming the African violet (s) and other plant material.

Polar Bears – are the largest and most powerful carnivore on land. They are found throughout the Arctic. Feature mainly white flowers in your design. (22"H x 18"W x 10" wings – maximum depth 14") Limit of 4 entries

Elephants – the world's largest land animals are herbivores. Their tusks can weigh up to 200 pounds and can grow up to 10 feet in length. Feature your interpretation in this unique design (22"H x 18"W x 10" wings – maximum depth 14") Limit of 4 entries

Zebras – These unique African equines are recognized by their distinctive blackand-white striped coats. Your arrangement should come alive with stripes. (22"H \times 18"W \times 10" wings – maximum depth 14") Limit of 4 entries

Beavers – are the largest rodents in North America. They have stocky bodies with a yellow-brown to almost black coat and a broad, flat, scaly tail. They are known for their use of wood. Incorporate some wood into your design. (18"H x 15"W x 9" wings – maximum depth 12") Limit of 4 entries

<u>Flower Arrangements</u> – Use fresh-cut African violet blossoms in a design with other fresh cut, dried or treated plant material. Niches are white. Backboards or draping may be used if attached with pins, but tape is not permitted on the niches. You must include an index card with each exhibit naming the African violet (s) and other plant material.

<u>**Pandas**</u> – Round black ears and black eye patches stand out against a white face and neck; this captivating appearance has endeared Pandas to people worldwide. Show us your interpretation of the Panda. ($12^{\circ}H \times 10^{\circ}W \times 6^{\circ}$ wings – maximum depth 8°) Limit of 4 entries

<u>Butterflies</u> – There are about 17,500 different species of butterflies which come in an array of colors and sizes. The smallest butterfly is only about 1/8 of an inch whereas the largest butterfly is nearly 12 inches. Show us your Butterfly vision in this kinetic arrangement. (22"H x 18"W x 10" wings – maximum depth 14") Limit of 4 entries

Lemurs - indigenous to Madagascar, Lemurs range from 2.5 inches to 2.5 feet tall. They are the only non-human primates with blue eyes and the attractive ring-tail is a feature in several varieties. Lemurs became popular after appearing in several Disney movies. Your miniature arrangement will be staged in front of an 8" disc which will be supplied. Limit of 10 entries.

<u>Starfish</u> – are commonly called Sea Stars because they're not a fish. There are over 2,000 species of Sea Stars living in all the world's oceans. They have the ability to display striking colors that camouflage them amongst plants and coral. Create your underwater arrangement completely submerged in water. Limit of 6 entries.




